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
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- India's Apr-Nov'24 LPG imports were around 16.62 MMT, showing an increase since Apr-Nov'23 which stood at 15.52 MMT.

GAIL signs long-term charter contract with K-Line for LNG ship

- GAIL signed a long-term charter hire agreement with Kawasaki Kisen Kaisha, Ltd (K-Line) for a newly built LNG ship, which will begin operations in 2027.
- The ship, with a tank capacity of 1,74,000 cubic metres, will be built by Samsung Heavy Industries Co Ltd, Korea, through a ship-owning company in Singapore.
- GAIL currently operates four LNG vessels—GAIL Bhuwan, GAIL Urja, Grace Emilia, and Maran Gas Pericles— with two more ships expected to join its fleet next year.
- GAIL has a diversified LNG sourcing portfolio of over 15 million tonnes annually from multiple global sources, primarily transporting LNG from North America to meet domestic and international demand.

LPG demand to decline 7% by 2030 on growing piped natural gas adoption

- India's LPG demand is expected to decline by 7% by 2030, dropping to 27.6 MMT due to the rapid adoption of piped natural gas (PNG), compared to 33 MMT without this shift.
- Domestic PNG connections are projected to grow tenfold to 12.5 crore by 2032, driven by the expansion of city gas distribution networks across the country.
- The study highlights that PNG is cheaper than LPG, leading to significant demand erosion in the domestic and commercial segments.
- In 2023-24, India consumed 29.6 MMT of LPG, with imports rising due to slower domestic production growth, while PNG supply comes from domestic natural gas fields.

India will supply LNG to Sri Lanka's power plants

- India plans to supply liquefied natural gas (LNG) to Sri Lanka's power plants, connect the power grids of both countries, and lay a petroleum pipeline between the two nations.
- India has provided \$5 billion in line of credit and grant assistance to Sri Lanka, supporting projects across all 25 districts based on Sri Lanka's development priorities.
- India will provide monthly scholarships to 200 students from Jana and Eastern Provinces starting next year and train 1,500 Sri Lankan civil servants over the next five years.
- Both countries agreed to finalize a defense cooperation agreement and enhance collaboration on hydrography, recognizing their interconnected security interests.

Qatar agrees five-year LNG supply deal with India's GAIL, sources say

Qatar has agreed a deal to supply India's top natural gas distributor GAIL with liquefied natural gas for five years, three sources familiar with the matter said on Monday. Qatar Energy Trading will ship one cargo a month to GAIL starting in April, the sources said. The gas will be priced at around 115% of Henry Hub plus \$5.5-\$6 per million British thermal units (mmBtu), the sources said.
